March Baronial Business Meeting Minutes

Old Business

Jen— Challenge of the Heart. The event flyer was submitted and will be in the Kingdom Newsletter in May and June. If we wanted another 1/2 page for the event the cost will be another \$40, making the total \$80. There was also a request for \$120 for material for the tapestries and team banners for the event.

- Serena's web business has a portion of the sales going to Dun Carraig. \$145 was raised. It was brought up to use the money from Serena for event expenses. Cathal made the motion. Kiri was the second. The motion was passed unanimously. The remaining \$60 will come from Baronial funds.

Hank— The Valentine's Day Dinner was a success. Major thanks to the Barony, including special thanks to Rose, Cathal and Greg. Thanks to all who served. The original price was \$8 a plate. The final result was \$5.50 a plate. Hank has stated that he will assist next year for whoever wants to do the dinner.

- Jonathas said that we are penciled in for February 2006.
- Kiri asked about the possibility of having the Valentine's Day Dinner on a Saturday night.

Molly— The Newcomers meeting is on Monday the 21st at Good Samaritan Church at 7:30 PM. She is not sure what the topic will be.

- Continued use of the church for Baronial meetings will be voted on by the church on the 16th.

Cathal— Stepping down from the Chronicler position. Lylie will be stepping up. Cathal has said that he will stay on in the deputy position.

- The first quarter report is due in April. Cathal will take care of that

for Chronicler and show Lylie how to do it.

- The new Chronicler needs to be warranted. Bozhana is looking into how that is done.

We are currently planning weekend workshops in addition to our regular A&S Nights. I know several of our members are working on projects for upcoming Arts & Sciences displays. To assist in this endeavor, I would be happy to offer my services (such as they are) to aid in the creating and/or proofreading of your documentation. You've gone through the

work of making the thing, now take your entry to the next level by documenting the process to it's best advantage. Evenings work best for me, but I'd be willing to be flexible if it means Dun Carraig members will be entering their best possible work. Please don't hesitate to give me a call. Contrary to what His Lordship Muirghen might say, it is a relatively painless process! (Note: This jest is aimed at his Lordship in fun and is sparked from base jealousy relating from the fact that his entry did so well at KASF.)

We are making plans for our upcoming Challenge of the Heart event in June. The Dun Carraig A&S Champion will be chosen on that day. **Your entry does not need to comply with the Competition/Display themes in order to be considered for this honor.** I will be placing an "open display" area for entries that do not match the criteria set out in the competition theme. For those of us with a competitive bend, the event will feature something to please almost everyone. We will be hosting a "Best Token of Love" competition (documentation required, any medium is acceptable). We will also be hosting a "Best Field Presence" competition (to be decided by the Ladies of the Gallery). "Field Presence" will consist of appearance, bearing and goodly speech. We will also be sponsoring a fun display: "A&S Projects that DIDN'T Work". Documentation is not required, but you must specify what the item was intended to be, what went wrong and what you learned from the experience. The A&S Officer will determine the winner and special consideration will be given to tragically humorous outcomes. Finally, Dun Carraig will be hosting an "Artists Pavillion" to allow space for artisans to get together and work on their projects. It will be an opportunity to meet & greet other artisans, additionally providing newer members an opportunity to watch artisans working at their craft and answering questions.

The schedule is as follows:

- April 9** **Jonathas & Amalia's House**
Mead Brewing (Lord Michael von Schonsee)
Lord Michel von Schonsee the Kingdom Brewer his kindly volunteered to come to Dun Carraig and teach a Mead Brewing Class. The cost is \$20, which will go towards purchasing equipment and supplies which you will get to take home with your first batch of mead already started! Then you will have the equipment needed to continue brewing on your own. You must have pre-registered for this class with Baron Jonathas.
- April 12** **Cathal & Lore's House**
Leather Carving & Stamping (Lord Cathal)
This class will cover the basic process involved in stamping and carving leather and will include some hands-on time to practice the techniques described in the class.
- April 26** **Rose & Adenwald's House**
What exactly is a Pas d'Arms? (Sir Adenwald)
This class will cover the history of the Pas and how the tournaments were run in period. It will also cover the "Practical Pas" (what gets changed to make them work for a modern tournament).
- May 10** **Molly & Erwin's House**
Tournament Tokens (Baroness Mary Isabel)
This class will discuss the use of tokens in period and provide ideas for creating your own tokens/largess for use in our upcoming Challenge of the Heart event.
- May 15** **Rose & Adenwald's House**
Beer, Bread & Butter Workshop (Sir Adenwald, Mistress Rose & Baroness Mary Isabel)
This workshop will feature several different classes: In the Beer class, Sir Adenwald will be guiding the class on producing a Spruce Porter, covering the steps necessary to take the beer from grain to fermentation (due

to the length of time required for fermentation, the class will not be covering THAT process during the workshop). Mistress Rose will be offering a Bread IOI class, mixing and baking a variety of bread types. Baroness Mary Isabel will be leading a “hands on” class on making butter and fresh cheese from dairy products. The workshop is planned for noon.

**May 24 Jonathas & Amalia’s House
 Beginning Lucet (Lady Helewyse)**

Learn how to make your own cord and trim. I'll have lucets and string available for people who pre-register 2 weeks in advance (the kits will cost probably around \$5, I'll you know once I figure it out). You **must** sign up for this class if you want to have a pre-made kit available.

**June 14 Jynette & Erik’s House
 Advanced Chain Maile Patterns (m'lady Jynette)**

This class will pick up from m'lady Jynette’s Basic Chain Maile class and will start up with weaves. You should have a basic knowledge of chain maile production before taking this class. Participants are encouraged to bring their own tools, but the instructor will have some loaner equipment on hand.
